## Discover the new Peavey Plaza at Tuesday's mpls downtown council 2025 plan quarterly forum

**MINNEAPOLIS (August 5, 2019)** – The City of Minneapolis celebrated Peavey Plaza's grand opening on July 18. Now, it's time to enjoy this newly-renovated space.

The mpls downtown council invites you to its 2025 plan Quarterly Forum offering a chance to discover the new Peavey Plaza. The Quarterly Forum will take place **Tuesday**, **August 6 from 11:30 am-1:00 pm** at Orchestra Hall overlooking the renovated Peavey Plaza space. The program begins at 12 pm.

Today, Peavey's beauty from those memories has been revitalized," said **Steve Cramer,** president & ceo of the mpls downtown council and Mpls Downtown Improvement District. "The work done through public-private partnerships in helping restore Peavey Plaza is a fantastic example of what collaboration and vision can accomplish. Peavey Plaza is again a must-see Minneapolis destination."

- The process and steps taken in making the Peavey Plaza renovation a reality
- Public-private partnerships that made this renovation possible
- Coen+Partners' vision for Peavey Plaza's new design, including accessibility, greening and environmental considerations

Built in 1975 and designed by landscape architect M. Paul Friedberg, Peavey Plaza is a notable example of modernist architecture. It was added to the National Historic Registry of Historic Places in 2013. In 2018, the revitalization project officially broke ground as part of a public-private partnership with funding from the City of Minneapolis, State of Minnesota, and private donations raised by the mpls downtown council and Green Minneapolis.

Today's renovation features restored water fountains and fixtures, new trees, grass and plantings, enhanced lighting and improved accessibility.
